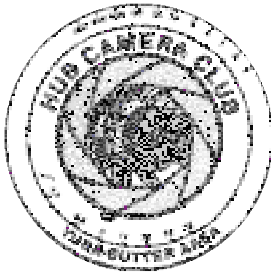

Images will continue to be displayed with only a title and not the name of the photographer. Any questions about submitting images, please refer to the Roster / Guideline Book.

Treasurer's Report is available in the f-stop. The f-stop is sent electronically to all members with a current e-mail address and snail mail to those without an e-mail address.
